It is an artificial intelligence platform which accurately pinpoints a students gaps in knowledge or weaker areas in a subject, it then makes a learning pathway of nuggets (mini lessons) individualised for each student according to their abilities and strengths. It also gives them valuable advice as to how to improve even further.

It is suitable for students in years 7 to 11 and covers mathematics, English, sciences, IGCSE geography and P.E. theory
