


English in Action:

YEAR 8



To enrich this learning further, we hope to arrange a visit to museums in Dar es Salaam, where students can explore Tanzanian cultural heroes, monsters, and myths firsthand, bringing their classroom learning vividly to life.

YEAR 9

Students have begun an exciting new unit on The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas. As well as exploring the novel's themes, historical context, and moral questions, students will develop their drama skills by taking on both acting and directorial roles. This will allow them to explore character, tension, and staging in thoughtful and creative ways. The unit promises to strengthen not only analytical skills but also empathy and collaboration.

YEAR 10 & 12

Students have reached the halfway point in their courses and are making excellent progress. Both year groups are deepening their analytical skills and producing increasingly sophisticated responses to literature and language texts. It is encouraging to see students growing in independence and confidence as they work steadily towards their final examinations next year.



YEAR 11
